

God's Healing Mindset

5 Keys to receiving your healing. 5 points to focus on. This is how God sees us. God's ability to comfort, God's mercy, God's peace, God's Healing God's Hope. Recognizing these will bring comfort and joy.

#1 Comfort From a Heart of Love

Psalm 23:4 Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil: for thou art with me; thy rod and thy staff they comfort me.

Psalm 119:76 Let, I pray thee, thy merciful kindness be for my comfort, according to thy word unto thy servant.

II Corinthians 1:3,4 (AMP) Blessed [gratefully praised and adored] be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of mercies and the God of all comfort, ⁴ who comforts *and* encourages us in every trouble so that we will be able to comfort *and* encourage those who are in any kind of trouble, with the comfort with which we ourselves are comforted by God.

#2 Mercy From a Heart of Love

This would be the second point to focus on for your healing.

Ephesians 2:4 *But God, who is rich in mercy, for his great love wherewith he loved us, 5 Even when we were dead in sins, hath quickened us together with Christ, (by grace ye are saved;) 6 And hath raised us up together, and made us sit together in heavenly places in Christ Jesus:*

Philippians 2:1,2 *If there be therefore any consolation in Christ, if any comfort of love, if any fellowship of the Spirit, if any bowels and mercies, 2 Fulfil ye my joy, that ye be likeminded, having the same love, being of one accord, of one mind.*

Philippians 2:1,2 (AMP) Therefore if there is any encouragement *and* comfort in Christ [as there certainly is in abundance], if there is any consolation of love, if there is any fellowship [that we share] in the Spirit, if [there is] any [great depth of] affection and compassion, ² make my joy complete by being of the same mind, having the same ^[a]love [toward one another], knit together in spirit, intent on one purpose [and living a life that reflects your faith and spreads the gospel—the good news regarding salvation through faith in Christ].

#3 Peace From a Heart of Love

The third point to focus upon is Peace from a heart of love from the Father.

John 14:27 Peace I leave with you, my peace I give unto you: not as the world giveth, give I unto you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid.

Psalm 29:11 The LORD will give strength unto his people; the LORD will bless his people with peace.

Isaiah 26:3 (AMP) You will keep in perfect *and* constant peace *the one* whose mind is steadfast [that is, committed and focused on You—in both ^[c]inclination and character], Because he trusts *and* takes refuge in You [with hope and confident expectation].

#4 Healing – From a heart of Love.

The fourth point to focus on is God's will is healing from a heart of love.

Psalm 6:2 Have mercy upon me, O LORD; for I *am* weak: O LORD, heal me; for my bones are vexed.

Psalm 30:2 O LORD my God, I cried unto thee, and thou hast healed me.

Isaiah 53:4-5 Surely he hath borne our griefs, and carried our sorrows: yet we did esteem him stricken, smitten of God, and afflicted. **15** But he was wounded for our transgressions, *he was bruised for our iniquities: the chastisement of our peace was upon him; and with his stripes we are healed.*

#5 HOPE – From a Heart of Love

This final point of focus for the believer to receive his or her healing is understanding the hope that we have from God's heart of love. Of course, hope is not only important to understand and focus upon, but it also is not based on a fantasy of what the future might bring. Hope is very real! To have this hope is knowing the God will send His Son back for us to gather us together. This future reality is spelled out very plainly in I Thessalonians.

I Thessalonians 4:13 But I would not have you to be ignorant, brethren, concerning them which are asleep, that ye sorrow not, even as others which have no hope.

14 For if we believe that Jesus died and rose again, even so them also which sleep in Jesus will God bring with him.

15 For this we say unto you by the word of the Lord, that we which are alive *and* remain unto the coming of the Lord shall not prevent them which are asleep.

16 For the Lord himself shall descend from heaven with a shout, with the voice of the archangel, and with the trump of God: and the dead in Christ shall rise first:

17 Then we which are alive *and* remain shall be caught up together with them in the clouds, to meet the Lord in the air: and so shall we ever be with the Lord.

18 Wherefore comfort one another with these words.

Hope is real! If Christ comes back after our lifetime, it makes no difference because the "speed" at which he comes back will seem the same as if we were still alive. Once a person falls asleep in Christ, there is no sense of time in death.

PSALMS 6:5: For in death *there is* no remembrance of thee.

PSALMS 146:4: His breath goeth forth, he returneth to his earth; in that very day his thoughts perish.

ECCLESIASTES 9:5: For the living know that they shall die: but the dead know not any thing neither have they any more a reward; for the memory of them is forgotten.

Vs.10 Whatsoever thy hand findeth to do, do *it* with thy might; for *there is* no work, nor device, nor knowledge, nor wisdom, in the grave, whither thou goest.

The Word of God is very simple to understand if we just read what it says and believe it. In this case, the subject of death and what happens after death is pretty easy to understand. And it is not just mentioned once or twice in the Word, but several times. No breath, no thoughts, no work, no device (meaning: no intelligence or reasoning), no knowledge, no wisdom in the grave.

I Corinthians 15:42-54 (WT) ⁴² So it is with the resurrection of the dead. The [human] body that is sown is perishable *and* mortal, it is raised imperishable *and* immortal. ⁴³ It is sown in dishonor, it is raised in glory; it is sown in weakness, it is raised in strength; ⁴⁴ it is sown a natural body [mortal, suited to earth], it is raised a spiritual body [immortal, suited to heaven]. As surely as

there is a physical body, there is also a spiritual *body*.⁴⁵ So it is written [in Scripture], “The first MAN, Adam, BECAME A LIVING SOUL (an individual);” the last Adam (Christ) *became* a life-giving spirit [restoring the dead to life].⁴⁶ However, the spiritual [the immortal life] is not first, but the physical [the mortal life]; then the spiritual.⁴⁷ The first man [Adam] is from the earth, earthy [made of dust]; the second Man [Christ, the Lord] is from heaven.⁴⁸ As is the earthly man [the man of dust], so are those who are of earth; and as is the heavenly [Man], so are those who are of heaven.⁴⁹ Just as we have borne the image of the earthly [the man of dust], [□]we will also bear the image of the heavenly [the Man of heaven].⁵⁰ Now I say this, believers, that flesh and blood cannot inherit *nor* be part of the kingdom of God; nor does the perishable (mortal) inherit the imperishable (immortal).⁵¹ Listen very carefully, I tell you a mystery [a secret truth decreed by God and previously hidden, but now revealed]; we will not all sleep [in death], but we will all be [completely] changed [wondrously transformed],⁵² in a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, at [the sound of] the last trumpet call. For a trumpet will sound, and the dead [who believed in Christ] will be raised imperishable, and we will be [completely] changed [wondrously transformed].⁵³ For this perishable [part of us] must put on the imperishable [nature], and this mortal [part of us that is capable of dying] must put on immortality [which is freedom from death].⁵⁴ And when this perishable puts on the imperishable, and this mortal puts on immortality, then the Scripture will be fulfilled that says, “DEATH IS SWALLOWED UP in victory (vanquished forever).

God has set all of these five things to be part of our lives. All are present-day realities for us. His comfort is always there. His Mercy is always there. His peace is always there. His healing is always there. His hope is always there, and will be there until Christ returns. When he comes back, our hope becomes our true physical reality. We will no longer be waiting for him to return.
